
As of this writing (May 14), the ALPO Solar Section received 26 submissions of observations of the Mercury Transit. The transit was welladvertised in the JALPO and Solar blog through John Westfall's article about the transit. In order to accommodate the request to provide a number of images taken exactly at the full hour, a number of submissions were filed which were taken to the second at XX.00 .00 UT. It is our understanding that some of these images have been used by individuals to re-calculate the distance between the Earth and the Sun (1 AU).
